## Traffic Shift on State Road (SR 836)

**Miami** — On **Tuesday morning, February 21** all westbound traffic on SR 836 will be shifted to the left from east of NW 72 Avenue to west of SR 826. In order to prepare for the traffic shift, the following lane closures will occur between the hours of 11 p.m. and 5 a.m.

- **Sunday, February 19-** The westbound State Road (SR) 836 loop ramp on the right hand side that connects drivers to southbound SR 826/West Flagler Street will be closed. The westbound SR 836 to southbound SR 826 flyover ramp on the left hand side will remain open.

Westbound drivers on SR 836 wanting to exit at West Flagler Street can:

- Continue west on SR 836 and exit at south NW 87 Avenue
  - Continue south on NW 87 Avenue to connect with West Flagler Street
- **Monday, February 20-** All three mainline lanes on westbound SR 836 will be detoured to the NW 72 Avenue/ SR 826 North ramp where they can merge back to westbound SR 836.

This shift is in preparation for the closure and removal of the left hand flyover ramp to SR 826 south from westbound SR 836 that is currently scheduled for Monday, February 27. **Please note that this schedule may change due to bad weather or other unforeseen conditions.**
